Two Parish Gardens Open on Sunday 19th July 2-5.30pm in aid of St. Wilfrid's Hospice
Four Winds, Petworth

Location: As you leave the main square in Petworth go up the High Street, 1/4 mile past the surgery turn left into Grove Lane and Four Winds is at the end. This lovely garden is owned by Dickon and Phyllis Ann Dutton-Forshaw. As the name implies it can be quite windy, but with one of the finest views in Petworth it is a truly memorable setting. A magnificent herbaceous border full of colour, a beautiful rose garden with not even a black spot in sight and a superb display of vegetables. Sit back and enjoy a cuppa with uninterrupted views to the South Downs. There is no entry fee, but donations to St. Wilfrid's would be greatly appreciated.

Rectory Gate House, Rectory Lane, Petworth

Location: Immediately opposite St. Mary's Church, next to Barton's Lane. In contrast to the other parish gardens, opened in recent weeks, this is a small town garden with a varied mixture of plants and shrubs. The owners Peter and Joanna Laughton do not want any entrance charges and are hoping that you may consider a donation in support of St. Wilfrid's. There are a small number of home grown plants and cuttings to swell the kitty! If you are kind enough to visit both these gardens, why not start here and then enjoy tea, beauty and refreshments at Four Winds.
